- Addir: Majestic, big, broad, wide
- *Elohim*: God, divine being
- Etsba: a finger
- *Gittith:* unknown, perhaps an instrument or melody associated with Gath
- *Mashal*: to have dominion, to rule, govern
- Paqad: to take care of, to oversee, to appoint
- Tehillim: "praises;" the Hebrew name for the Book of Psalms
